

Jesus Built His Church

Our congregational theme for 2025 is "Jesus Built His Church". Because of our location on the timeline of history, we can state this using the past tense verb "built". At Caesarea Philippi--when Jesus first spoke the word "church" in His earthly ministry--He used the future tense: "I will build My church" (Mat. 16:18). Its existence on earth began in the first century A. D. after Jesus' resurrection (Acts 2:47) and from that point in history onward, the use of the past tense (I.e., "built") has been factually true and historically accurate.

Let's consider each word in this simple declaration and note important, relevant truths connected to each part of this statement.

Jesus built His church. Joshua is the Hebrew equivalent for the Greek name "Jesus". It means "Jehovah is salvation". Because of the excellent role model Moses' assis-

tant (Ex. 24:13) and successor (Deut. 31:14-23) Joshua was, many Jewish babies were given this honorable name. The firstborn son of Mary, however, was named Jesus because of the unique spiritual deliverance and victory He would provide for His people (Mat. 1:21). During His ministry, the incarnate Son of God was often identified as Jesus of Nazareth (Mark 1:24, 10:47).

Once He had fulfilled all things written about the Christ in the Law, Psalms, and Prophets, the inspired New Testament writers often and accurately refer to Him as Jesus Christ. And, since He has been given all authority in heaven and earth (Mat. 28:18) and has been exalted to God's right hand (Eph. 1:20-21), the inspired New Testament writers also refer to Him as the Lord Jesus Christ.

Jesus' declaration that the gates of Hades (I.e., His death in which His spirit entered the Hadean realm) would not prevail against Him and thus prevent the building of His church is a most audacious claim. Like David in preparation for the building of the temple by Solomon, Jesus made provisions for the building of His church (I.e., the apostles) but the church itself was not constructed until after His death at Calvary. The existence of His church is a historical fact which is clear and compelling circumstantial proof of His resurrection and His deity. He was declared to be the Son of God with power by His resurrection (Rom. 1:4) and it is the fact that He is the Christ, the Son of God, which serves as the impregnable bedrock foundation of His church (Mat. 16:16, 18).

Jesus **built** His church. A carpenter by trade prior to His preaching ministry (Mark 6:3), Jesus was familiar with construction. Like any wise artisan, He knew that a house was only as good as its foundation (Mat. 7:24-27) and that inferior workmanship results in embarrassment and shame (2 Tim. 2:15).

It is interesting to note that the first time this verb (*oikodomeo*) is used in the Greek translation of the Old Testament is in Genesis 2:22. Here, it is written: "And the rib which the Lord God had taken from man, made (I.e., built) He a woman..." Just as Adam's bride was built by God out of the material taken from his side, so Christ's bride--the church--was created from the redeeming blood which flowed from His side. And, just as God made the perfect counterpart and companion for the first Adam, He has built the perfect counterpart and bride for the last Adam.

As noted above, the past tense verb "built" is historically accurate. Jesus' construction of His church was initiated in the first century after His resurrection and every spiritual asset needed for its establishment and continual perpetuation was once for all time delivered in the faith, the written New Testament. Because of the imperishable nature and power of God's word to purify souls when penitent believers obey the truth (1 Pet. 1:22) and because those saved by Christ's blood are added by Him to His church (Acts 2:47), it is Biblically accurate to also talk of Jesus building His church in every generation, including ours. (Because the New Testament verb "edify" is the same Greek word Jesus used in Matthew 16:18

Jesus built **His** church. Just as Adam had a wife--built by God--which belonged exclusively to him, so Christ has a church which is uniquely and exclusively His. Each member wears His name by calling him/ herself a "Christian" (1 Pet. 4:16). Every congregation of His church wears His name by identifying themselves as "churches of Christ" (Rom. 16:16).

Jesus built His **church**. This building is a spiritual, not a physical structure. Every person born again spiritually by the incorruptible seed of God (1 Pet. 1:23) through the washing of regeneration and renewing of the Holy Spirit (Titus 3:5) is a living stone in Christ's spiritual house (1 Pet. 2:5). NEVER in the New Testament is this house used in reference to a denominational organization. NEVER in the New Testament is this bride of Christ used to refer to a harem of denominational wives. The vile taproot of denominationalism is that Jesus is some sort of spiritual polygamist. This is obscenely filthy and repulsively gross.

Jesus promised to build His church, and He kept His promise. A year of careful study and rich spiritual truths await us.
